PROGRAMS

SAME Café

The flagship program of So All May Eat has been around for nearly 13 years. Each year hundreds of volunteers, dozens of gardens and farms, and the incredible staff serve delicious meals to everyone, regardless of ability to pay.

SAME Food Truck (2019)

Inspired by the success of SAME Café, the SAME Food Truck will launch in 2019 to make the mission mobile. It is expected to nearly double the number of meals served by So All May Eat and will focus primarily on food deserts in Denver.

Cook to Work (2019)

The hundreds of guests who volunteer in exchange for a meal will be welcomed to join C2W as they volunteer, a job training program designed to fit into their volunteer time and resulting in employment in the restaurant industry.

SAME Garden (2019)

So All May Eat is partnering with MetroCaring to create a community garden plot that will grow food for the Café and Food Truck and provide hands-on gardening skills to volunteers
